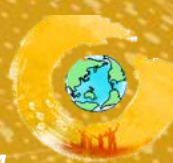


Commitments to the Global Health Security Agenda 2024 Targets

Identifying and Addressing Gaps

Conducting a JEE, prioritizing 5 technical areas, developing a costed NAPHS, changing national legislation or policy

ARGENTINA

commits to completing and publishing a **National Action Plan for Health Security** by the end of 2020 and improving national capacity on biosafety and biosecurity with the **development of policy frameworks**

INDONESIA

commits to **implement activities** laid out in the recently developed and launched **NAPHS 2020-2024**

NETHERLANDS

commits to conducting a **Joint External Evaluation in 2021** to assess their country's current state of health security preparedness, **developing targeted tools** to address specific WHO Benchmarks for the IHR, and **creating a Biosecurity Resource Toolbox** for the EU to address IHR aspects of biosafety and biosecurity

PRIVATE SECTOR ROUNDTABLE

commits to **providing countries with private sector innovations, tools, and trainings** at no cost to support the achievement of their National Action Plans for Health Security, introducing countries to at least 5 tools annually

THAILAND

commits to conduct an **intra-action review of the COVID-19 response** in 2020

UNITED STATES

commits to **continue implementation** of activities outlined in the **U.S. JEE National Action Plan** across all technical areas

Building Political Will and Coordination

Establishing a multisectoral committee, ministry-level office or cabinet-level coordinator for global health security

INDONESIA

commits to building coordination through its newly established **multisector global health security committee**

ITALY

commits to **creating a multidisciplinary research group** within one year to explore the norms that regulate the One Health sector and better understand organizational bottlenecks

KINGDOM OF SAUDI ARABIA

commits to establishing a **multisectoral health security committee**

PAKISTAN

commits to establishing an **office of global health security** in June 2020 and a **multisector global health security committee**

THAILAND

commits to establish a **National GHSA/IHR Committee** comprising representatives of multiple sectors in advancing the implementation of GHSA, as well as designating an office to strengthen cooperation on GHSA

Investing in Health Security

Mobilizing domestic resources and development assistance for national, regional and global health security

AUSTRALIA

commits **\$59.9 million to strengthen health security** in the Western Pacific and Southeast Asia regions and commits more broadly to promote and financially support international and multilateral health security initiatives

CANADA

commits to **distribute \$5 million to global health security capacity building** as part of \$159.9 million to address the COVID-19 outbreak globally

FINLAND

commits to working with Tanzania to **build local capacity for infectious disease monitoring and biothreat management** until 2024

NETHERLANDS

commits to **support multiple countries in the Middle East and North Africa** to improve IHR capacity by 2021

THAILAND

commits to collaborate and provide technical assistance to **requested countries** in capacity building of the field epidemiology and laboratory system

UNITED STATES

commits to **working with at least 17 partner countries** to strengthen capacity in 5 technical areas

WORLD BANK

commits to **support at least 25 countries with implementation of pandemic preparedness plans** by June 2022

Documenting Progress and Best Practices

Sharing best practices and publishing reports of domestic and global progress towards the GHSA 2024 targets

AUSTRALIA

commits to supporting the **facilitation of thematic-based dialogues around best practices** for GHSA members

GHSA CONSORTIUM

commits efforts to **identify, document, and disseminate best practices & lessons learned** related to COVID-19 and health security

KINGDOM OF SAUDI ARABIA

commits to **share best practices** on AMR, including surveillance and antimicrobial stewardship

PAKISTAN

commits to **share best practices and lessons learned from COVID-19** by July 2020

PRIVATE SECTOR ROUNDTABLE

commits to publishing an **annual progress report** featuring its activities across key global health security action areas, **facilitating discussions** during Ministerial meetings on the private sector's role in GHSA and **organizing a briefing series on the COVID-19 pandemic** to identify areas of engagement for the private sector

THAILAND

commits to share/publish reports demonstrating progress on laboratory system strengthening and workforce development

THAILAND

commits to share the findings of the intra-action review report

UNITED STATES

commits to **tracking progress** in addressing the gaps identified in the first JEE and **publishing a summary report** of progress in 2021

Advancing Steering Group Priorities

Contributing to the Secretariat, Task Forces, Action Packages, and other leadership roles to advance GHSA 2024

ARGENTINA

commits to active membership and participating in the **AMR Action Package**

AUSTRALIA

commits to membership in the **Workforce Development Action Package**

CANADA

commits to contributing to **Action Package Coordination, Accountability and Results, and Advocacy and Communications Task Forces** as well as continuing participation in the **Biosecurity and AMR Action Packages**

FINLAND

commits to continue exchanging experiences and developing possible solutions as part of the **GHSA Steering Group, Biosafety and Biosecurity Action Package, and Sustainable Financing for Preparedness Action Package**

GHSA CONSORTIUM

commits to **providing technical support to one additional Action Package**, in addition to its membership of the **Sustainable Financing Action Package** and chairing of the **Advocacy and Communications Task Force**, and support GHSA in **active outreach to non-governmental organizations** to increase engagement

KINGDOM OF SAUDI ARABIA

commits to **supporting the GHSA website** and its capabilities as well as working with Action Packages to align activities with GHSA 2024 objectives as lead of the **Action Package Coordination Task Force**

PAKISTAN

commits to **joining the GHSA Secretariat** in 2021

PRIVATE SECTOR ROUNDTABLE

commits to work with the **Sustainable Financing for Preparedness Action Package** to strengthen the business case for domestic and international investment in health security, including private sector mobilization

NETHERLANDS

commits to continue serving as **GHSA Steering Group Chair**, as well as actively participating in the **Action Package Coordination Task Force, Biosafety and Biosecurity Action Package, and AMR Action Package**

REPUBLIC OF KOREA

commits to leading the **Immunization Action Package**, sharing knowledge, and building regional capacity

THAILAND

commits to take up the **GHSA Chairmanship** in 2021 and establish a Secretariat supporting office

THAILAND

commits to collaborate with other contributing members and others GHSA members in implementation of the regional activities of the GHSA Action Packages: **Antimicrobial Resistance, Biosecurity & Biosafety, Laboratory Systems and Workforce Development**

THAILAND

commits to foster partnerships, networking of laboratory networks, and multi-sectoral workforce development through existing regional networks including the Regional Public Health Laboratory Network, ASEAN+3 FETN, and ASEAN Veterinary Epidemiology Group in outreach to other regions

UNITED STATES

commits to continue leading the **Laboratory Systems and Sustainable Financing for Preparedness Action Packages**, leading the **Stakeholder Engagement and Accountability and Results Task Forces**, and continue participation in six other Action Packages and both additional Task Forces
